


Coming this May: Sankofa 2025!

Healing Groups are safe, multisession small groups led by certified facilitators where people with heart wounds can come together to find healing, engage with scripture, learn to feel safe, and know they are valued. This small-group experience is also helpful for those who wulk closely with others who must cope with trauma and losses, both big and small.

Adult healing groups are meant for those ages 18 and older and are not intended to be a replacement for professional mental health care.

Sankofa at Home



This month, Sankofa at Home visits the University of Minnesota to remember the Morrill Hall Takeover.

On January 14, 1969, Black students from the University's Afro-American Action Committee (AAAC) occupied the bursar's and records office in Morrill Hall, located on Northrup Mall. The overnight takeover served as the cultimisation of events on campus following the assassination of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on April 4, 1968.

Following the takeover, the University agreed to three demands which President Malcolm C. Moos described as "immanently reasonable." Click below to read how these demands shaped the University for years to come.
